Looking at the calendar today and it is the first week of May, but when I think of all the National AACA activities already completed this year it seems that it should be at least August. It has certainly been a busy year so far with many miles covered to great locations.

We started in February with our National Convention in Chantilly, Virginia. Attendance was up again this year including several of us from East Tennessee. With a full schedule of seminars and other activities a good time was provided for all.

Then in March The Puerto Rico AACA Region sponsored another great Nationals with ETR members Rick, Dawne and Jordan Lay in attendance. No sooner than that was over, the next weekend it was on to Cartersville, Georgia to the Winter Nationals. This is a story about my 1931 Pontiac. And it will be, but first I must provide some addition information for clarity while reading the story.

Being the firstborn for my parents, I must have received extra attention as they tried to understand who I was at an early age. My mother always said that "I was born with cars on the brain and scissors in my hand". Cars because she also said at two years old I did not ask "Where was I born?" but "What car I was transported home in?" Scissors, because at an early age. she said I loved to cut pictures from magazines and mount them in scrapbooks. I still have two such scrapbooks, mostly of cars, that I did when I was four.

Fast forward. There are many other stories about me and cars and motorcycles better told at another time. Such as how I bought my first car (a 1941 Chevrolet) at age nine (which I could not drive then) with money I made cutting grass and later, running a paper route. In the high school era, I fell in love with model A Fords. I had eight Model A's all needing work when I graduated. Also during that time, I participated in dirt track motorcycle racing and building and using drag race cars.

Best of all, though, during high school I dated a great girl named Sis. At first it was not about cars for her, but she did like riding in my '41 Chevy. But she quickly found that being with me meant liking cars. And she did for the rest of her life. I proposed to her in 1960 in the Chevy!

Now, about the Pontiac. The year was 1957 and I was in college. I was still dating Sis who was a senior in high school and now loved old cars with me. I was attending an antique car show one weekend when I saw the 1931 Pontiac and took a picture of it with the owner. I think I was drawn to it because it was not a model A. I kept the picture but never really thought of the Pontiac again...that is, until October 1958.

Unbeknownst to me, the owner of the Pontiac who I had met in 1957 was a salesman at Rogers Cadillac Pontiac located in downtown Knoxville at the corner of Cumberland Ave and Henley Street. He still had the Pontiac but wanted to sell it. He had parked it on the dealer's used car lot next to Cumberland Avenue. Returning home from work that evening, my father, who had no real interest in old cars, while passing the lot, saw the Pontiac and stopped. After looking at it and talking to the owner, he bought it for \$350, with the understanding that he would deliver the car to our house the next day and park in the garage. Very unusual for my father though he would acquiesce to my hobby now and then.

Now, for the rest of the story. Earlier in the day that my father bought the car Sis and her mother were returning home from shopping downtown, passed the dealer lot and saw the Pontiac. She made her mother turn around and go back to look at it. She learned the "turn around and go back to look at an old car on a lot trick" from me! She loved it and told her mother to buy it saying "please, Tom will love it too." However her mother was one who would not rush into buying anything that was not on the shopping list until she went home and "slept on it". So they went home. Sis called the dealership the next day only to learn it was sold. She was not happy.

The weekend after the Pontiac was purchased, being away at college, I went home for the weekend. Upon arrival that Saturday morning my father said to me not to bother his new car that he bought and parked in the garage. Of course I went to look expecting a new car since he did trade at least once a year. I could not believe what I saw. My father bought an old car? Knowing I had come home for a date with Sis that evening I had to ask if I could drive it to her house thinking she would certainly like to see it. Father said yes. Of course I had no idea what had transpired with Sis and her mother earlier in the week. Upon arrival at Sis' house you can imagine the scene - the surprise for Sis and her mother and my learning the rest of the story. We drove the car for at least an hour that night. What a story! I guess we were meant to have the Pontiac.

Sis and I bought and enjoyed and sold many antique cars over the years. But why now after sixty eight years do I still have the Pontiac? I believe the story above was always there. We thought about it whenever we drove it. It became part of our family. And then there was my father. I believe the Pontiac was the only old car he ever bought for me without me knowing it. He died of a heart attack seven months after the purchase!

It just proves to me that the saying we have repeated many times "It is the cars that bring us together but the people and the stories that hold us together!" still applies!

**Call to Order:** Matt Sartin, President, called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm.

**Roll Call:** Susan Baker, Secretary, did roll call with attendance as noted above.
