
Gillenwaters Award

The Gillenwaters Award is presented each year to a popularly elected member who has



The device is used to synchronize engines such as his 1934 Packard, having a four lobe cam and two sets of contacts (ignition points). As advertised back when by Joseph Weidenhoff, Inc., the device synchronizes with either high tension spark or lamps. "A perfectly synchronized distributor means better engine performance and greater fuel economy."


