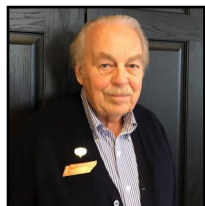

Although there was not the traditional trade show and the number of seminars were reduced, guests enjoyed some unusual and very entertaining programs about automobiles as well as Colonial History.



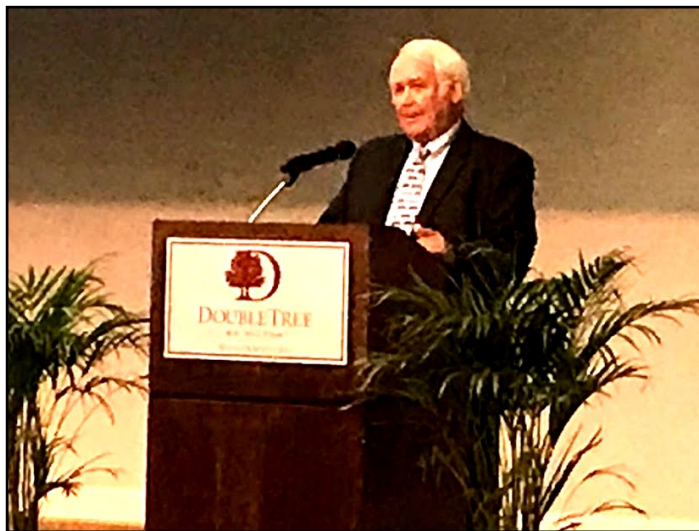

One of the highlights of the convention was the First Lady's Breakfast, which featured guest storyteller Sheila Arnold, who assumed the character of Ol' Bess, an enslaved tavern keeper in Colonial Williamsburg. Through her storytelling, "Ol' Bess" painted a picture of what life was like during the Revolutionary War, for both the patriots who frequented the tavern, and the slaves who provided for them. Ol' Bess's stories were at times, hilarious and at times they brought tears to the eyes of the listeners.

On Friday evening, a panel of antique car experts shared their knowledge about the state of the old car hobby today and told stories about their adventures and misadventures along the way. The speakers included West Peterson, Editor of "Antique Automobile," Richard Lentinello, writer for "Crankshaft Magazine," and Tom Cox, automobile appraiser and former AACA national President.

The Saturday General Meeting, conducted by President Jim Elliot, was focused on the progress of the new AACA National

Headquarters in Hershey, PA. The facility, which houses the world's largest Automotive Research Library, will soon be open to the public.

have been a member of the AACA National to utilize this complimentary membership. We have an application for membership for Herb and Susan Thomas. The motion was made and seconded to approve their application for membership and the motion carried.

Club Liability Insurance – Tom Howard reported that the insurance coverage is in two parts. One is a form that is used for locations where we have an event where we furnish proof of insurance coverage. This protects the owner of the property in the event of damage on their property. The other form is coverage for members and officers of our regional club that would cover us in the event someone would take legal action against us. Both forms can be found on the AACA web site. Neither insurances cover any damage to anyone's vehicle in the event of an accident or damage to anyone's vehicle. The liability insurance for the vehicle owners will cover that type of damage.

The cost of this coverage is paid by the AACA National. Every year the AACA National sends a suggested invoice for this coverage that can be paid if agreed to by the board.

AACA Raffle – Robert Quillin updated the board that he had received 20 raffle tickets for a Jeep Commando that will be raffled off at the Hershey Regional AACA Fall Meet in October. The winning ticket holder does not have to be present to win. Tim Seay suggested we offer the tickets to the club membership first and any tickets that are not sold be offered to anyone at the July Auto Through the Ages Show at Townsend.

Autos Through the Ages – Tim Seay reported that the date of this event will be July 17th at the Heritage Center at Townsend. Logan, with the Heritage Center, has agreed that the funds for this event will be managed by our car club. Both Steve West and Jerry Hodge have agreed to financially support this event with a \$500.00 donation, as well as the Blount County Chamber. With all the funds being given to our club, we will be responsible for reimbursing the Heritage Center for their expenses for this event. Tim asked for a copy of prior flyers that we have used in order to put together a flyer for this year's event. Sandra Quillin has a list, from past years, of volunteers that have either helped or signed up to help in last year's event that was canceled due to Covid.

2023 Divisional Tour – Roger Frazee reported that we have a name for the tour. The name of the tour will be Secret City Tour. The theme will be all things Oak Ridge and surrounding

areas. The first day will be led by Len Royston's team and will include a trip up to Brushy Mountain Prison and then a scenic drive back to Oak Ridge and probably visit a Oak Ridge attraction. The second day will be led by Tim Seay's team and be to Blount County around the foothills of the Smokies. The third day will be with Charlie Simpson's team and focus on Oak Ridge attractions as well as Museum of Appalachia and Norris Dam. Jan Frazee has been negotiating with the motels and has gotten what is felt to be the best possible contract with the three motels. We will only be penalized if we were to cancel this event. Jan Frazee reported that the group room rate for all three motels is going to be \$112 plus state and local taxes. Roger Frazee has asked for approval from the Board to accept the terms of the contractual agreement. This will be forwarded out in an email to the Board for an email vote of approval. This email vote of approval needs to be turned around quickly so we can sign the proposed contract with the motels. Following the board meeting, an email vote was taken to approve the hotel contracts. The vote passed on May 14.

Foothills Transitional Care and Rehab – For those that can attend, this will be a drive through with our antique automobiles this Friday. We will meet at Victory Baptist church at 2:45 PM and begin driving through at 3 PM.

Possible location of future board meetings – Sandra Quillin reported mileage distances from various points of interest to various board members' homes to look at possible options for our upcoming board meetings. Tim Seay has determined that the Maryville Century 21 office, which has a room that they use for training, would be a place we could meet. It is located at 205 Foothills Mall Drive in Maryville and is very close to the prior meeting location at TN Bank. The motion was made and seconded that we utilize the space at the Century 21 office for our next board meeting. This motion carried.

Board Meeting Schedule: The schedule for our Board meetings for the remainder of 2021 will be the following dates, July 6, September 14 and November 9.

The meeting adjourned at 8:19 PM.

Remembering ETR Member Ann Bly



East Tennessee Region member Ann Bly passed away on June 1st. Ann and her husband, Bob, enjoyed the antique car hobby together and could often be seen in one of their classic red Thunderbirds.

A native of Indiana, Ann devoted her career to nursing. Ann had a continually active professional career as a Registered Nurse. She was the medical/surgical nursing supervisor at Porter Memorial Hospital in Valparaiso, Indiana. After moving to Kokomo, Indiana she started Home Health Care of Howard County which was one of the first Home Care Agencies in the State of Indiana. She was the first President of the Home Health Care Administrators' Association of Indiana.

In 1991, the Blys relocated to Knoxville, TN where she worked in a variety of Health Care Organizations. Ann retired from nursing in 2009.

Ann was preceded in death by her parents, George and Elaine Gleason, a sister, Victoria, and her beloved son, Thomas. She is survived by her husband of 53 years, Robert, a practicing attorney in Knoxville, TN and a grandson, Cameron B. Collins, of Plainfield, IN along with his parents Monte and Teresa Collins.

Lois was the second of five in her family of Bladensburg, MD. She was born in Grand Junction, Colorado.

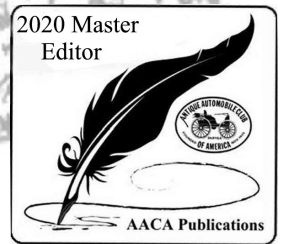
